Requirements for Appearing End Semester Examination

A student is expected to maintain 100% attendance in all courses as attendance also carries internal marks. A student will be qualified to appear for end semester examinations of a semester only if he/she satisfies the below mentioned requirements.

The student is permitted to appear for End Semester Examinations, only if he/she maintains minimum 75% of attendance. If he/she secured attendance greater than or equal to 60 % and less than 75% has to pay the necessary condonation prescribed by the college authority with necessary supporting documents for his/her absence.

Redo Category

A student who secures overall attendance less than 60% has to repeat the course with the approval, when it is next offered. A student secures attendance greater than or equal to 60% and less than 75% will be promoted to next higher semester only if loss of attendance is due to medical reasons(hospitalization/ accident/illness) or participation in sports event or any competitons or NCC or NSS activities documents and payment of necessary condonation fee as pescribed by the college authority. However student secures more than 75% of attendance in the current semester will be moved to next higher semester.
