16.9 R&D and Consultancy activities

- Dr.K. Velmurugan, Head/ Mech, R&D Coordinator presented on Research Forum activities. He detailed on the institution seed money of target Rs.10,00,000/- will be activated in the 3rd quarter.
- He presented the target of Rs. 32,23,000/- for grants received from Government and Non-Governmental agencies.
- He presented that the number of teachers having research projects of 22 for the year and 6 was attained in the first two quarters and remaining 16 will be achieved in the third and fourth quarter.
- ➤ He also presented that the publication of research papers in care journals is 226 for the Academic year 2020-2021 and 71 were published in the first two quarters and remaining 155 will be achieved in the third and fourth quarter. With regards to publication in Scopus/Web of Science indexed journals a target of 351 was fixed. A total of 98 was published in the 1st and 2nd quarters and remaining of 253 will be published in the 3rd and 4th quarters
- Consultancy works target amount of Rs.77, 22,000/- was fixed. In that 11,55,000 was achieved in the 1st and 2nd quarters and the remaining amount of Rs. 65,67,000/- is planned for 3rd and 4th quarters.
- > He pointed out the Research scholar details in the department of Mechanical Engineering
- ➢ He presented the detail on funds received from AICTE through various schemes (Institutional development schemes, Faculty Development schemes, STTP)
- The Academic expert pointed out that the R&D presentation need to have clarity on the amount of funds received from various agencies in the academic year 2019-2020 and compare the same with the academic year 2020-2021. He also suggested to brief on the various agencies offering consultancy work in each department and present the same in the next meeting.
- ➢ He also suggested to include the organization name from where the funds are received and the utilization of funds for the projects need to be summarized.

- He also presented various Employability and Enhancement courses conducted for the students in the first two quarters.

- S.Kailashkuumaran / IV Year/ICE student member appreciated the effort taken by the college towards the innovative initiatives in the placement activities and thanked the Management.
- A. Nethyasri / IV Year/CIVIL student member felt good in participating for the consecutive second time in IQAC meeting. She expressed her gratitude towards the effort taken by the staff members in placement and various other initiatives.
- The Academic Expert Dr.N.Alagumurthi, Professor and Head, Mechanical Engineering, Pondicherry Engineering College, Puducherry gave the following suggestions in the IQAC meeting. He said that the review of college Vision and Mission statements is good. He highly appreciated the NBA-Continuation of Accreditation. He suggested that Library budget has to fixed based on percentage of fund allocated to salary, maintenance and infrastructure facilities. The norms have to be followed. The range of percentage for budget allocation for infrastructure and library is to be mentioned.
- School of Arts & Science was asked to know about the scope of liberal arts course
- > Activities regarding Industry 4.0 should be added.
- Alumni contribution towards development of entrepreneurship skills, government job vacancies etc., need to appraised to the students.
- IQAC team was recommended to celebrate IQAC day to recognize the services of the staff. Newsletter for IQAC and IQAC annual letter highlighting meeting discussion has to be uploaded in website. IQAC manual and guidelines should be framed
- Academic and Administrative Audit should be made mandatory. He also added that there was good clarity compared to earlier presentation



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- It was decided that the discussion and suggestions given by the members will be taken forward as an action plan for the year 2020-2021 for execution. The meeting ended at 2.30 pm
