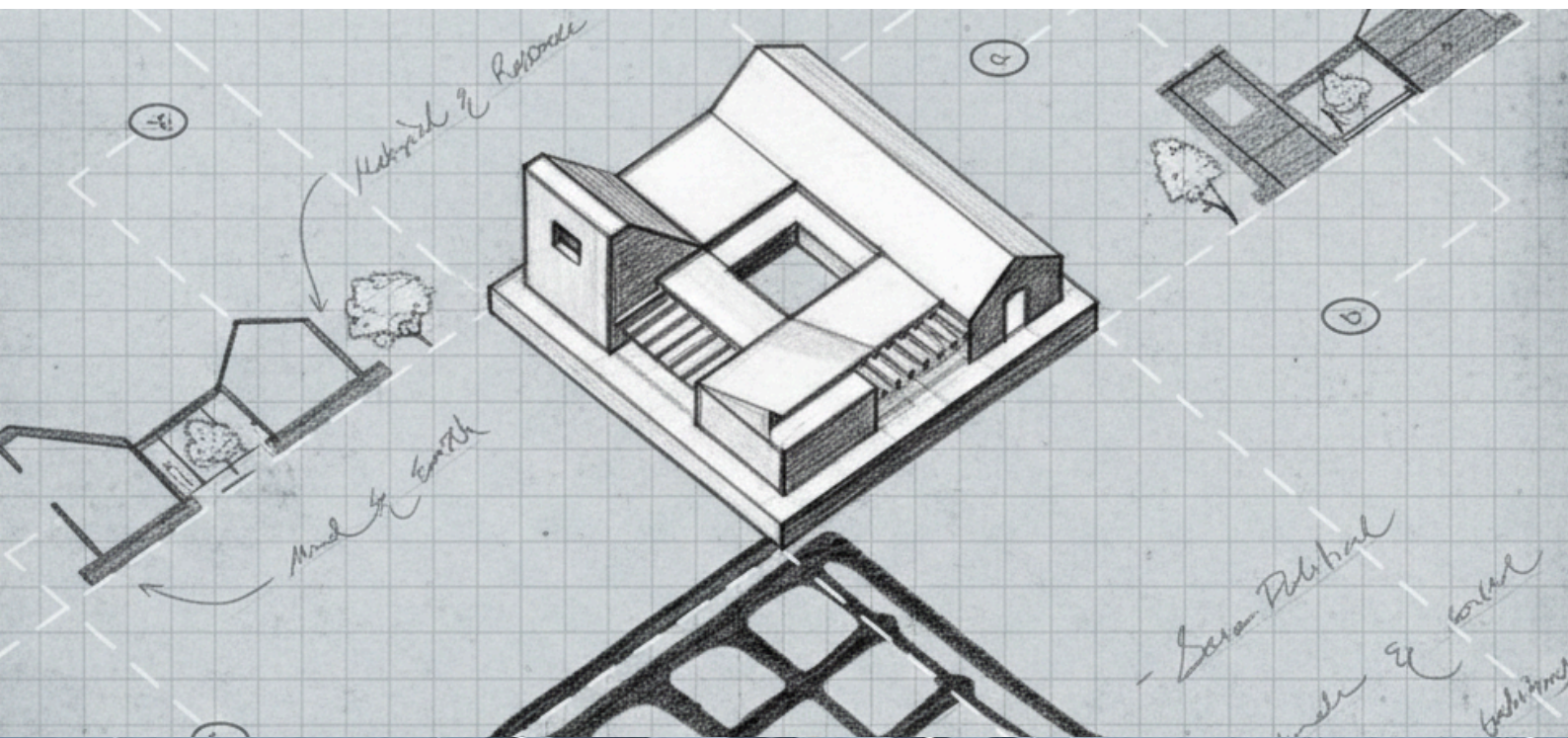
## ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION
