The Divyangjan Cell shall be guided by the provisions of the RPWD Act, 2016, Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992, UGC Regulations/Guidelines, and instructions issued by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Ministry of Education, Government of India, from time to time.

Composition of the Committee:

The Divyangjan Cell may collaborate with NGOs, Composite Regional Centre (CRCs) (for Persons with Disabilities), District Disability Rehabilitation Centre (DDRCs), and reputed organizations working in the field of disability empowerment and may involve the Institute community in outreach activities.

Term: The term of Divyangjan Cell committee shall be two years.

Meeting: The Divyangjan Cell shall endeavour to meet at least once every three months to deliberate on welfare and accessibility measures for PwD and shall submit Minutes of Meetings and recommendations to the Head of the Institution. In the absence of the Chairperson or any member, the Head of the Institution may nominate a substitute.

Functions of the Committee:

The functions of the Divyangjan Cell shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- a) Advising the Institute on admission, administration, examination, recruitment, and promotion policies to ensure equal opportunities for PwD
- b) Facilitating barrier-free access to classrooms, laboratories, library, hostels, offices, parking areas, toilets, and other campus facilities
- c) Facilitating provision of course materials in accessible formats (digital, large print, braille, audio, sign language, etc.
- d) Arranging for assistive devices and technologies to enhance independence and learning
- e) Providing academic, career, and psychological counselling to PwD
- f) Organizing orientation programmes, life skills and soft skills training
- g) Creating awareness about rights, entitlements, and support mechanisms available to PwD
- h) Sensitizing faculty, staff, students, and other stakeholders on inclusive practices and accessibility
- i) Exploring scholarships, fellowships, funding, and support schemes for PwD
- j) Acting as a counselling-cum-guidance forum on academic, financial, and social matters
- k) Facilitating participation of PwD in sports, cultural, and co-curricular activities
- l) Undertaking any other activity necessary to promote inclusive campus life.
